Courage

Courage is a trait that can be learned and practiced. Today's children need help building their confidence and skills so that they can be leaders – not just in the future, but also today. Being a leader requires courage, and parents can set a powerful example. Here are 5 ways to teach kids how to be brave at any age.

Lead By Example: Be open about your own fears and anxiety, then show your children how you work through those fears to accomplish what you set out to do.

- **1. Teach Honesty:** When you're up against a task that you don't want to do or something you're nervous about, pay close attention to your language. Talk to yourself with kindness about your fears, rather than taking a "pep-talk" approach and belittling your fears.
- 2. Offer Strong Role Models: From TV and films to history books, always jump at the opportunity to show your child an example of bravery, or to teach them other important moral lessons.
- **3. Role Play:** Encourage your children to pretend to play explorers, superheroes, adventurers, and other roles that let them "overcome" their fears to save the day.
- **4. Explain Courage the Right Way:** When you explain and encourage bravery, make sure that you're demonstrating just how many ways there are to be courageous. From choosing to do the right thing when others aren't to overcoming small fears, such as jumping off a diving board at the pool, your little ones need to see that courage comes in all shapes and sizes.

Teaching children how to be brave is a wonderful way to build confidence and it's a skill that they will use in every aspect of their life.

What Bullying Is and Is Not

What bullying is NOT

It is important to distinguish bullying from other unkind, mean and harmful behavior.

Calling someone a name or pushing someone once

Being rude or having an argument with someone is not bullying

Hurtful behaviour that kids do back and forth, to each other

Of course, these behaviors should be addressed but may have different consequences and interventions, which is why the distinction is critical.

What is bullying?

It involves:

Unequal power - One child has more power than another child (or it seems this way to the children involved). Hurtful actions - Physically or psychologically harmful behaviour takes place, which can be direct or indirect actions.

Repetitive behaviour - The hurtful actions keep happening.

One sided- The hurtful actions are done by one child to another and not reciprocated

To be defined as bullying, all 4 of the previous components must be present: (1) repeated actions or threats, (2) a power imbalance, (3) intention to cause harm and (4) one-sided.

HOW TO APPLY

PLEASE NOTE: The application process is online only. You are required to have a valid email account.

No internet access? Please contact your school for assistance.

Online applications begin on Monday, January 30, 2023 at 7:00 am. Applications will be assigned a date-time stamp on a first-come, first-served basis, which will factor into a student's placement priority.

Complete the online application as early as possible, and provide the required documents listed below <u>directly to the school</u> by email by **Friday, March 17, 2023**.

- 1. Student's **Birth Certificate** or other government issued proof of age and citizenship.
- 2. Proof of Parent/Guardian B.C. Residency
 - a. Combination BC Driver's License and Services Card (copy of both sides); or,
 - b. BC Services Card (copy of both sides) and one item from the list of supporting documentation below; or,
 - c. Proof of application for BC Medical Services Plan and one item from the list of supporting documentation below.
- 3. Proof of Parent/Guardian Living Address/Supporting Documentation
 - Ownership of a dwelling or long-term lease or rental of a dwelling;
 - Documentation indicating British Columbia residence (i.e. utility bill);
 - British Columbia registration of an automobile;
 - British Columbia Driver's License (copy of both sides); or,
 - A current income tax return filed as a British Columbia resident.


AFTER Thursday, August 31, 2023

New in-catchment area enrollments: Parents will receive a confirmation email when the school has accepted the student's application for enrollment. Board Policy 405R – Student Placement (Regulations), will be used to determine student placement and priority.

New out-of-catchment area enrollments: Parents <u>may not</u> be notified until after the summer enrollment period is over and all in-catchment area students have been placed.

Qualifying age: The School Act requires that a child must be five years of age by December 31, 2023, to qualify for school enrollment in September 2023. No exceptions.

Key Policies

BALL/SHIRT: Campers will only receive 1 camp soccer ball & 1 tshirt. If a camper attends 5 or more weeks of camp, they will receive a 2nd ball and tshirt during their 5th week of camp.

INCLEMENT WEATHER: While camp will continue at a designated shelter or indoor facility until inclement weather clears, soccer and some active games will likely not be played indoors. There are no refunds due to bad weather.

LATE PICKUP: If you pick up after 5:00pm (for full day sessions), you will be charged \$15/15 minutes. We reserve the right to ask you to withdraw from camp for multiple late pick ups past 5:00pm.

TRANSPORTATION not provided: We do not offer pick up or drop off service, however, if camp must travel offsite for any reason, we'll arrange bussing and your onsite Supervisor will notify you.

Camp Sessions

We have morning and full day sessions available. Campers will build confidence and exercise creativity as we foster an inclusive, engaging and active summer camp experience. Because many of our campers attend multiple weeks of camp we introduce different weekly themes in combination with a variety of activities, games and exercises. We're always striving to provide the best possible camp experience for your child.

Morning Sessions 9am - 12 noon

Morning sessions are geared towards campers who want a half day program and prefer a soccer focus. Daily programming consists of learning and playing soccer which includes individual skill development, small sided games, mini-Royal Cups & much more. Campers are grouped by age and size (and ability where possible) in group sizes of approximately 10 to 1 camper to staff (group ratios vary based on age & number of registrations).

Extended care available (\$\$): Drop off: 8 - 8:30 am (\$20/camper/week) Pick up: 12:30 - 1 pm (\$20/camper/week) **Drop off & pick up** (\$30/camper/week)

Full Day Sessions 9am - 4pm

Full day sessions are the most popular sessions as they combine our morning sessions (as outlined above) with our fun afternoon sessions (these are limited capacity). The afternoon sessions include more traditional camp games and a possible fun swim (where available). Afternoon swims are fully supervised by facility professional lifeguards along with our camp staff (swim is subject to availability as some locations may not swim everyday). To meet proper supervision ratios and pool regulations, at some of our locations campers aged 5 to 7 may not be eligible to register for full day sessions. Any swim concerns, feel free to call us or speak to your onsite Supervisor. Soccer may not be played in the afternoon sessions.
