



WWEST STEM Curricular Support Program: Year in Review

Our team has just completed the WWEST/iSTAND STEM Curriculum Support program for the 2023-2024 school year. We reached 1000s of students across British Columbia and the Yukon Territory. The Okanagan Region from Enderby to Peachland received no-cost, in-person, STEM curriculum linked activities, once a week for four weeks. Communities outside this region had our team visiting over the course of one week to maximize travel and learning time. We strove to reach all interested schools and completed the year in mid-May, sending seven instructors to Kamloops, one instructor in Lillooet, and three instructors to the Ucluelet and Tofino regions.

We would like to extend our appreciation (limləmt and Kukwstsétsemc) to all schools and staff for providing us with opportunities to collaborate and learn alongside you and your community. Our Lead Educators, Science Bob and Christine the Science Queen along with our team (Stasia, Katie, Zach, Rachel, Kaleigh, Jenna, Polina, Chanel, Mayu, Skylar, Advay, Alysha, Rebecca) had a tremendous year and are already working on plans for the 2024-2025 school calendar!

MAY STEM ACTIVITY

This month's STEM at Home activity is an Engineering Challenge: Can you design and build your own **Natural Water Filter?**

Terminology/Background Information:

- Engineering: a branch of applied science concerned with design and building structures, machines, and engines.
- Filtration: the process of removing materials from a liquid or gas by use of a medium that allows the fluid to pass through, but keeps the unwanted particles out.

Materials:

- One used plastic water bottle
- Scissors or knife to cut water bottle.
- Natural materials collected from outside to be used as filter material.
- Optional: An old sock/cloth, paper towel, coffee filter
- Elastic band

Instructions:

Step 1: Clean and remove the lid to the water/pop bottle

- Step 2: Cut the water bottle/pop bottle in half. Use the top to create the filter (invert it), and the bottom will collect the filtered water.
- Step 3: At the spout/opening of the bottle, create a barrier using a cloth or coffee filter, or even an old sock, to prevent things from falling through and secure it to the neck of the bottle, using an elastic band. To increase the challenge, is there something in nature you could use instead as the barrier?



- Step 4: Create layers of filtration by adding the natural materials you have collected. Would moss work well? How about sand? Are leaves or humus good options as the top layer to absorb water? What can you observe in nature to help you think about and build your filter?
- Step 5: With your layers of filtration complete, mix up a sample of "dirty water" using soil and bits collected from the ground added to water. Pour this mixture through the top of your filter and watch as it comes through the bottle and out the spout into the bottom half of the bottle. Was your filter a success, or is it back to the planning and collection stage?
- **CAUTION:** Do NOT drink the filtered water! This activity is an example of how natural filters can help to remove particulates from water, however, the water may still contain contaminants that are not safe to drink!

Activities (KELOWNA ONLY) will focus on the relationship between STEM and sport! NOTE: JULY 8-12 OR Separate registration for both camps is required. JULY 29-AUGUST 2 Calling all junior detectives! This camp focuses on solving CAMP CSI: FORENSIC mysteries using forensic science. Participants can look MYSTERY SOLVERS forward to hands-on activities such as fingerprinting, JULY 15-19 extracting DNA, chemical analysis, and much more! Join us for adventures in medical-based STEM! Learn about, MED SCHOOL 101 and participate in activities related to the human skeleton, JULY 22-26 form and function of major organs, and keeping our bodies healthy. OKANAGAN Learn about biodiversity, ecosystems, and food webs in the Okanagan region. This camp connects participants to STEM and nature in fun and educational ways. **ECO EXPLORERS** JULY 29-AUGUST 2 Participants will discover ways to keep our planet healthy through engaging in engineering design challenges and **PLANET PROTECTORS** science experiments. Climate change, natural resources, AUGUST 6-9 space and beyond, are some of the activity topics this week! This camp is all about encouraging young girls and those **GIRLS IN STEM** identifying as female to feel empowered to explore STEM AUG 12-16 through interactive activities. Calling all scientists! Join the WWEST team in a variety of STEM projects which will include chemistry, natural MAD SCIENCE sciences, and physics experimentation! **AUGUST 12-16** Using a STEM lens, we will look at flight, and space beyond TO INFINITY AND Earth! Design, play, and learn about the science of space BEYOND observation and exploration, as well as the technology and **AUGUST 19-23** engineering of flight and space travel!


