


By wearing an orange shirt on September 27th at Pearson, you commit to the enduring truth that EVERY CHILD MATTERS, every day and everywhere.

2023 McCreary Adolescent Report (Grade 7 to 12 Student Survey)

Youth who agreed/strongly agreed they felt	2018	2023
