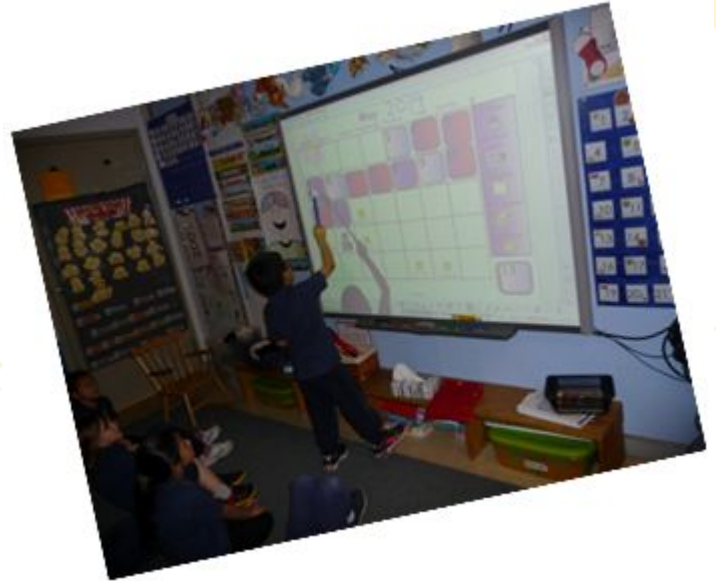

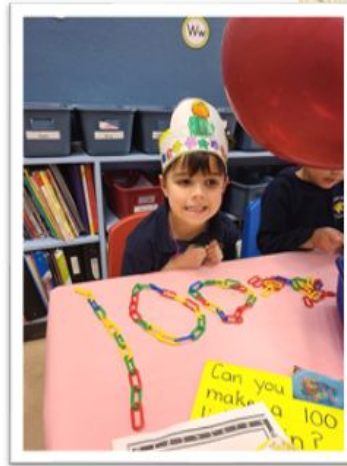

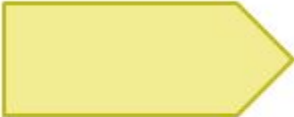
School supplies are provided by the school for a small fee - so please do not provide your own as we do not use them.



Important Documents



If you child has a medical condition: please see the secretary in the office or Mrs. Ferguson to get the required forms to ensure we are prepared to care for your child



Medications- staff are not able to give out medication to students without a signed release form by the parent and the physician.



Custody Orders- The school is an impartial party in any parental disputes. Schools go exclusively by the Custody Order that is signed and stamped by the court.



Volunteers When approved, we appreciate many parent volunteers for various activities. All volunteers must complete a Criminal Record Check. The secretary in the office can help with this.

Frequently Asked Questions



Q- How many children will be in my child's class?

A- Ministry regulations indicates that there can be up to 20 Kindergarten children per class.

Q- Who will be supervising my child at lunch and recess?

A- The school has lunchtime supervisors to ensure your child's safety. Your child will go outside with a lunchtime supervisor to play from 11:00-11:25 and then they will eat in their classroom and be supervised by our support staff and/or a lunchtime supervisor from 11:25-11:55. At recess we have 3 teachers supervising different areas of the school grounds.

Q- Do students have a nap time?

A- We do not have a nap time and activities are strategically structured to help students transition into a full-day Kindergarten program. From experience, children are usually tired when they get home from school for the first few weeks in their new Kindergarten experience.

Q- When do I meet the teacher and what is a gradual entry to begin the year?

A- This year we will be doing a parent-teacher Zoom meeting to help answer any more questions you may have. Kindergarten students begin the year with some mini sessions gradually leading up to full days around mid-September. We will send out a schedule of the Kindergarten gradual entry in June

Q- When can I purchase uniforms for my Kindergarten child?

A – We will confirm these dates in August. We usually have designated times when Kindergarten parents can come purchase uniforms.

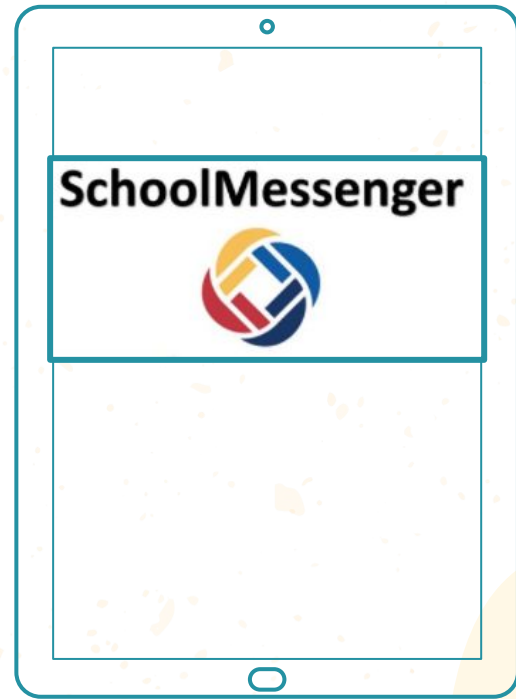
