In recognition of National Truth and Reconciliation Day the Grade 4 class at Pearson spent time connecting with the land at Chinchester Park. The provocation for the learning was using Shi-shi-etko a picture book by Nicola I. Campbell. The story draws students into a deep recognition of the importance of connection to land for a young girl about to go to residential school. Students spent time in circle, discussed the importance of land acknowledgments, and journaled with the land using their five senses. Students wrote about their connections to water, animals, and plants. In sharing they showed gratitude, responsibility, and respect for the environment and nature. The students will continue to work on developing a reciprocal relationship with the land and gaining a deeper kinship with all our living and non-living relations.
